Mother's Day Celebrations

Yesterday afternoon, mothers of Prep students arrived carrying a plate of treats to share for the annual Prep mother's afternoon tea. It was a very festive gathering, the students were delighted to have mum in their grade while mothers enjoyed the occasion to see their children in class and talk with others present. NAPLAN Tests next week

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will sit the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy. There will be four tests over three days: on Tuesday students will sit the language conventions and writing tests, on Wednesday the reading test will be held with the final test, numeracy held on Thursday morning.

If your child is feeling anxious about the tests, you can reassure them in several ways:

Remind him/her it is just one of many assessments carried out in the school

Discuss the strategies teachers have suggested e.g. read the whole question first, take time to understand what the question is asking, eliminate the obviously wrong options before making your decision

Discuss how they felt at the end of the first day and provide supportive advice.

School Oval top dressed

There was 120m³ of sand-turf spread over the oval on Tuesday. This has reduced tripping hazards and made the playing area much safer for competitive games. Students will not be able to play on the oval until next Wednesday to allow the top dressing to settle in.

Attendance at School: Every Day Counts

Regular attendance at school is very important for your child's learning and social development. Acceptable attendance is 95% and above. We understand that sometimes children are sick and need to stay home to get well. But other than that, children need to be at school as much as possible to ensure that they have the best opportunities for learning.

Regular daily attendance helps ensure students have a successful educational experience. Irregular attendance can interfere with your child's progress and learning.

The table below gives you an indication of how attendance impacts on your child's learning. A day here or there does not seem like much but:

<u>When your child misses just</u>	<u>that equals</u>	<u>which is</u>	<u>Accumulated effect P-12</u>
1 day a fortnight	20 days a year	4 weeks of school	nearly 1.5 years of learning.
1 day a week	40 days a year	8 weeks of school	nearly 2.5 years of learning.
2 days a week	80 days a year	16 weeks of school	over 5 years of learning.
3 days a week	120 days a year	24 weeks of school	over 8 years of learning

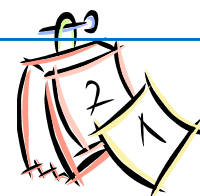
